Letter from the Mayor



Happy New Year! 2022 was a very exciting year in Cumming with various projects beginning, as well as some concluding. Overall in the past year, our city has seen an 18% increase in our population.

The Great Western Crossing continues to add homes after the successful Home Show in 2021. Two Villas were built with one being occupied and another being built. The Mercantile opened and continues to add events to their calendar. The business area is under construction currently with another section of the walking/bike path complete. This year we hope to see new business in this area and townhomes.

The Hy-Vee project paused construction then restarted with plans to open the distribution center in 2024. They are currently scheduled to open the Fast & Fresh and Smokey Row late fall of this year. We intend to have a walking/bike trail from the Great Western Trail to the Fast & Fresh this year.

Iowa Distilling has almost completed their new building.

Our city annexed 556 acres of land south of Cumming Avenue for Wilson's Orchard, the Agrihood and I-35 business development. Wilson's Orchard planted apple trees and strawberries last spring. They hope to be open for a limited selection this year. We are continuing to work with Diligent on the development of the land directly south of Old Town to continue our business district south.

Last year residents, Planning & Zoning members, Park and Recreation Board members, City Council members and business leaders spent all year working on a Comprehensive Plan for our city. We have a public hearing on January 9th and would like input.
